

How to find aged care grey literature using Google Advanced Search

Searching the internet can be both time consuming and overwhelming when trying to answer a question, however, with the power of advanced searching on Google, it is even easier to find the type of information you need online.

1. Go to Google Advanced Search: www.google.com/advanced_search

2. Create a search on aged care

Enter search terms in the following sections to create a search for aged care. Note the double quote marks around "aged care". This produces better results as it ensures the two words are searched together as a phrase.

Find pages with...

all these words:

this exact word or phrase:

any of these words:

none of these words:

numbers ranging from: to

3. Add your topic of interest:

You will probably want to know something specific within the context of aged care and because this is a specific phrase, we have added to the 'exact word of phrase' field in quotation marks. We have added our main topic terms of interest concerning technology in the 'all words' field.

Find pages with...

all these words:

this exact word or phrase:

any of these words:

none of these words:

numbers ranging from: to

4. Restrict the search:

Use Google's limit options on the second half of the search page to target the search to more relevant information sources.

You can limit by:

- Region, Language, Currency or PDF documents only
- Organisational type (.org.au for Australian organisations, .gov.au for Australian government sites, and .edu.au for Australian educational and research organisations)

In this example, we limit the search on "technology" in aged care to PDF documents (file type) on Australian government websites (site or domain: .gov.au). We have also selected English for language, Australia for region, and 'up to a year ago' for last update.

Then narrow your results by...

language:

region:

last update:

site or domain:

terms appearing:

SafeSearch:

file type:

5. Run the search

Click on the blue Advanced Search button at the bottom of the page.
